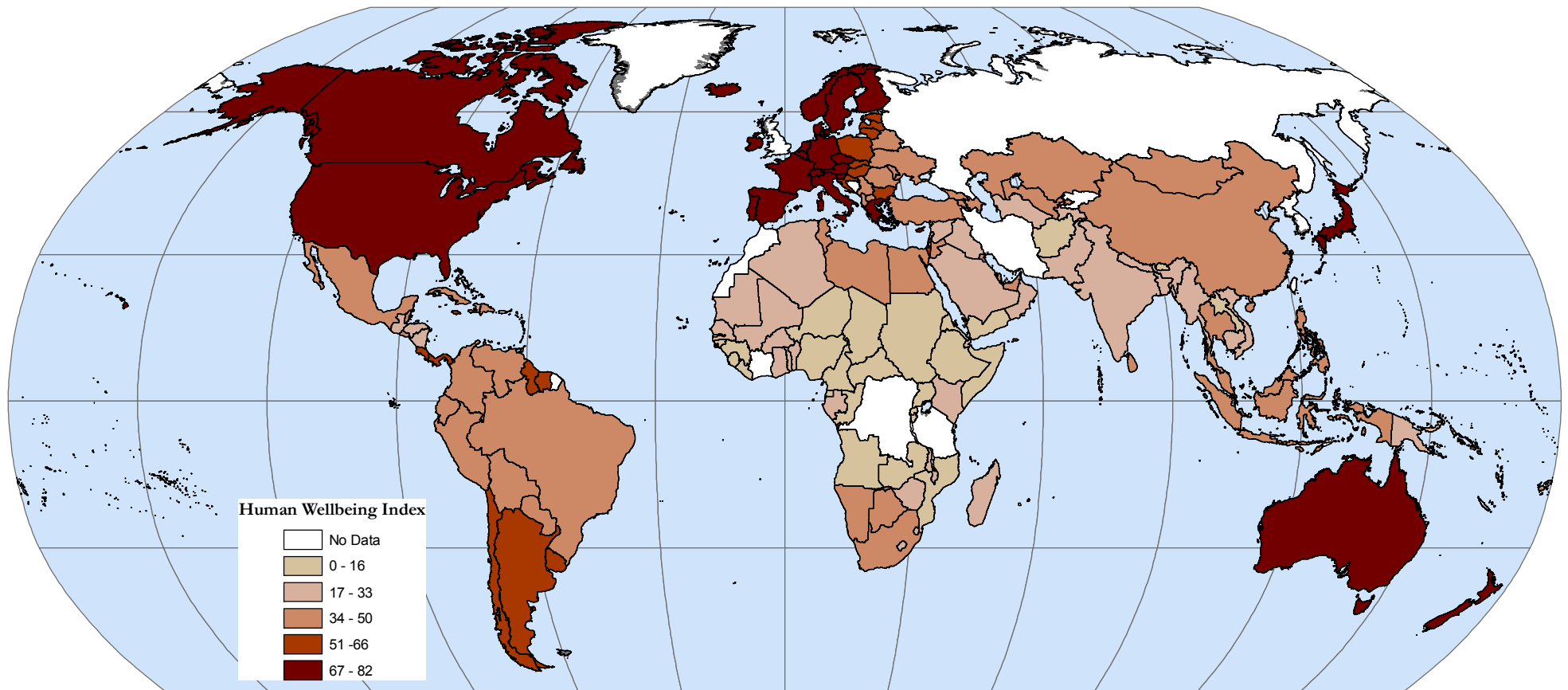


The Wellbeing of Nations - The Human Wellbeing Index 2001

Index Description:

The Human Wellbeing Index (HWI) is a composite index where 0 is the worst possible score and 100 is the best.

The HWI is the average of the indices of health and population, wealth, knowledge, community, and equity or the average of the indices of health and population, wealth, knowledge, and community, whichever is lower. The resulting HWI measures the success level of the intended goals of a higher level of human well-being with respect to the indicators above.
